Dear Friend,

2021 was a year of hope and recovery, thanks to the advancement of healthcare and the dedication of the health workers around the world. At Spreeha, our communities in Bangladesh experienced the same hope and recovery, although the first half of 2021 remained as challenging as the year before. Due to the second wave of COVID-19, Bangladesh went through multiple lockdowns affecting many of our programs.

The social impacts of the pandemic was profound in our communities, especially among young girls as the risk of early marriage increased. Malnutrition among children also increased by approximately 18% during the pandemic.

Continuing our adaptive and innovative approaches to tackle social problems, we started new areas of services such as telehealth services and Youth Clubs in remote areas. We put more focus on Adolescent Girls Club with social and health awareness to prevent early marriage, and children's health to prevent malnutrition.

At the same time, we maintained all our existing healthcare, education, and skills training programs. Our chapters in Boston, Dallas, and Seattle have been vigilant in serving local communities.

We are delighted to report that one of our education program participants, Limon Ali has been admitted to a prestigious public medical school. He dreamt to be a doctor when he was in eighth grade, and now he is on the path to reach his dream – this is possible because of your belief in Spreeha!

COVID Response of the Pandemic

Challenges

- 2nd Wave of Covid-19
- Lockdowns
- Progga schools closed
- Spreeha Community Resource Centers closed
- Omicron brought a significantly higher number of lung diseases

Mitigation and Adaptation

- Teachers and Community Workers went door to door to bring school to our students' homes
- Online platforms to coordinate meeting with Progga Club facilitators
- Telehealth
- Raised healthcare awareness and services door to door

Last Summer, one of Spreeha's communities in Satkhira, in the southern part of Bangladesh was hit hard by Cyclone Yaas. Spreeha provided 12,800 meals to 400 families in this remote community.

Second Year of the Pandemic

Spreeha in partnership with BIN (BUETian Investment Network) distributed food and hygiene materials to low income families in the Rayerbazar and Mirpur area.

The packages were distributed to 130 families in Rayerbazar and 70 families in Mirpur.

Size of the food and hygiene material distribution pack was designed according to the family size and their need for balanced nutrition.

Mother-child healthcare makes underprivileged pregnant mothers aware of the importance of antenatal and postnatal checkups during pregnancy. No maternal deaths were reported among these cases. One still birth case was reported in the month of February.

Spreeha also provided malnutrition screening for under-five-years old children at their homes. There was a rising trend of malnutrition cases during the pandemic. Spreeha is closely monitoring this along with food and nutrition capsules distribution.



Shaheda's Actions to Prevent Her Son's Asthma

Yasin had an acute Asthma problem ever since he was a baby. He was sick most days without being able to play outside. Spending 10 days per month at the hospital wasn't uncommon. In 2015, he started going to Spreeha's education program and a teacher referred him to Spreeha clinic. Shaheda immediately took him there and counseled the doctor about his struggle with Asthma. According to Dr. Nusrat's supervision, he was put under medication and Nebulizer treatment – which he was prescribed to be inhaled at least two to three and sometimes, four times daily. His treatment at Spreeha continued for 4 long years and slowly things started to change. It was first noticed when he was found playing outside with no issues of sneezing or breathing. Yasin's condition has improved drastically since.

During the pandemic, Spreeha brought schools to our students' homes. Maintaining the safety measures, teachers & community workers went door to door with school supplies and engaged students in pre- and after school activities.

Shams & Nasreen Scholarship Award of Spreeha has been designed to help students to sustain in multiple levels of education. It provides support for admission and tuition fees, books, supplies, and equipment related expenses. A total of twelve students received the scholarship in 2021.

Rabbi once observed Spreeha's after-school program's dance class from a distance and was very excited about it. The teacher encouraged Rabbi to sign up for the class. He was the only boy in the entire class. In a community like Rayer Bazar, a boy's passion for dance is often frowned upon or ridiculed. But Rabbi was not dissuaded by what others thought.

He mentioned how friendly and supportive other students of the class were and how comfortable everybody made him feel while dancing altogether. Besides dancing, Rabbi is known for his many other talents since he joined Spreeha in 2018. He likes many forms of art from crafts to music to dance.

Spreeha makes sure that Rabbi and children like him get the chance to nurture their creative sides and live their passion in a safe and secure environment.

Progga

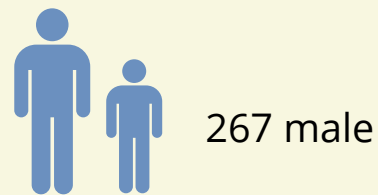
Progga is a creative leadership program empowering adolescents with essential life skills that bring forth their leadership qualities from within. Through the club, young girls and boys engage in activities promoting self-definition, confidence and thus enabling them to transform societies as active participants. Progga is operating in remote locations. Spreeha completed the following milestones in 2021:

Support for Rohingya Refugees

Spreeha organized a health camp at Camp 12, Kutupalong Rohingya Camp on December, 2021. The health camp provided doctor consultation, diabetic test, safe medicine, consultations on child health and women health.
